

## 2019-2020

The COVID-19 pandemic, ongoing pandemic caused by the police killings of Black people, the uncertainty with the DACA program and daily stressors of being an immigrant amidst growing anti-immigrant rhetoric moved us to state a clear holistic approach to supporting the needs of students from immigrant & refugee backgrounds.

#### CREATE A WELCOMING CAMPUS CLIMATE

- Co-hosted opening event with First Cats for 185 guests (83% were students) to bridge first-generation student & immigrant identities
- Hosted two-day training for 19 students with Trinice McNally to identify tools for collective advocacy, building power, and establishing intersectional work from a queer, Black, immigrant lens.
- Trained 126 educators on campus, at AZNASPA conference, & College Knowledge for Counselors conferences
- Collaborated with advisors to launch campus-wide plan to support students with DACA
- The ISRC remains one of 58 centers in the U.S. and one of two in AZ.

# CREATE ACCESS TO & SUPPORT TRANSITION AT UA

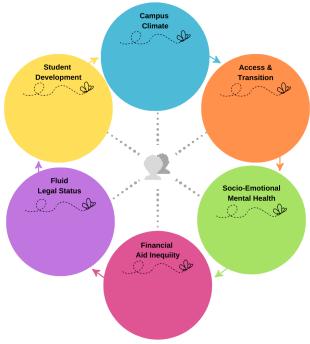
- Advised 27 high school youth with an undocumented status during Immigrant Scholarship Hustle on accessing scholarships and college
- Provided college access and financial aid resources to 157 students through in-person and online presentations and tabling events

# SUPPORT SOCIO-EMOTIONAL MENTAL HEALTH

- Worked with Office of Multicultural Engagement to cover costs of services from UA CAPS for 17 students
- Hosted healing space for 6 students from immigrant & refugee backgrounds with Liliana Campos, trained facilitator from University of San Francisco
- Hosted 4 wellness events for 139 students with campus partners (African American Student Affairs, Dean of Students, First Cats, Institute for LGBT Studies, Common Ground Alliance, Guerrero Student Center)
- Hosted a 2.5 hour weekly healing space for 12 weeks for students from immigrant and refugee backgrounds with the support of a trained counselor

#### SUPPORT STUDENTS' FLUID LEGAL STATUS

- Hosted DACA application renewal drive and ongoing DACA application support for 23 students
- Connected 11 students to immigration attorneys and local organizations that provide free legal services
- Created an Immigration Legal Services position starting fall 2020

### ADDRESS FINANCIAL AID INEQUITIES

- Connected DACA students (fall: 30, spring: 36, summer: 11) to \$179,000 in private scholarships
- Connected 52 students impacted by COVID-19 to \$19,000+ in grants to pay for rent, school, & medical expenses
- Collaborated on Immigrant Scholarship Hustle to help students with undocumented status apply to scholarships

#### **DEVELOP STUDENTS**

- Employed 11 undergraduate and graduate student staff, 1 Graduate Assistant, 2 part-time staff, 1 Coordinator
- Hosted 201 1:1 advising sessions with over 78 individual students
